We don't manage spoils. If it is a building demo our environmental group does. If it is line construction work spoils they manage it.	Xcel
We recently had several jobs where this applied. We use contractors and third parties to remove and evaluate soil before choosing one of two methods of disposal available.	
I've answered the questions based on spoils generated from elec/gas field operations. We have both internal and contractors that manage spoils. Spoils brought back to our yards and/or jobsites are contained and disposal is overseen by our environmental department. Pre-jobsite soil assessment is conducted when possible to profile spoils and they are handled accordingly based on the assessment.	Nisource
