


# 2025 Cultural Facility Benchmarking Program Overview



# Introduction


This document describes the 2025 Cultural Facility Benchmarking Program, endorsed by IAMFA, the International Association of Museum Facility Administrators.

This benchmarking program is designed for those who manage museum and cultural institution facilities. Over 130 institutions from nine countries have participated since the program started.






Facility Issues transitioned the system from email & Word documents to Excel then Power BI



# Program Provides Data & Metrics

Quantitative performance metrics are the language of business.

- Your position vs. peers
- Document your current situation
  - Confirm your competitiveness to defend performance
  - Identify weak areas to justify action
- Identify Trends
  - Measure progress to determine how effective changes are
  - See industry trends
  - Promote mindset of positive change and growth

Qualitative metrics identify potential actions you can take for performance improvements.


- Degree of use for practices & technology
  - Space management
  - Custodial services
  - Maintenance
  - Utility conservation & sustainability
- Identify specific opportunity areas and actions
  - Quality improvements (non-cost performance measures)
  - Incremental changes
  - Step-function changes


# Comparing Metrics → Provides Context & Trends

“Ready to share” with full range of facility-related metrics grouped on pages by topic.




See position relative to others and magnitude of difference for many key metrics

Technical support with 1:1 as needed


- Additional support if desired

## *The Value of Benchmarking:*

- *Part of an overall performance metric program*
- *Draws on actual performance data for forecasts and “what-ifs”*
- *Benchmarking data provides context → identifies the current high/low data values for many metrics*
- *Quantify the opportunity of getting to “top quartile”*
- *Participants contribute to raising the bar for everyone!*

# Suggested Process to Evaluate Benchmarking Results

1. Understand Your Organizational Objectives
2. Review Your Performance (*Particularly vs. Your Objectives*)
  - Scan all metrics of interest
  - Focus on metrics / trends for your priority areas
3. Identify Potential Actions To Consider
  - Triage and select actions to pursue (use Action Matrix on next page)
  - Discuss lessons learned with colleagues
4. Communicate Results of Your Review
  - Report overall performance and recommendations to leadership.
  - Communicate key metrics with staff & reasons for any initiatives
5. Track Progress on Initiatives, and Trends in General
  - Monitor trends of key metrics to measure & report progress
  - Perform ad-hoc queries/review to respond to emerging issues/questions
  - Share lessons learned from your initiatives & learn from others

# Action Matrix: Performance vs. Objectives

Action Plan: Draft activities such as policy/practice change, capital investment in facility or technology, shift in resources, etc.

- To achieve \_\_\_ performance improvement (or address \_\_\_ deficiency)
- Over \_\_\_ time period.

We primarily rely on the BMS to manage and report on T/RH. Prior to my arrival in 2022, there was frequent comparison between HOB0 readings and the BMS. Our collections folks have not shared HOB0 readings with me. I'm not getting any push from them to make any adjustments. We have a new CEO. I suspect he will be very open to a more sustainable policy.
